April - the first full month of Spring. We can awaken to a wickedly, warm, beautiful day, only to retire to a blustery winter-like day. There is gardening to be done, but not with a large amount of urgency.

Here are a few things to do in April...after the wildflower seed has been sown.

**A**spen can be planted to enjoy the golden colors in the fall. Sundance has lots to choose from!

**P**ansies are the toughest flowers there are and can be planted now. Their colorful, mustached petals can brighten even a snowy day.

**R**aking those pine needles and cleaning up perennial beds.

**I**nsects are beginning to come out of hibernation. Visit our Sundance Garden Center for information on what to plant to bring beneficial insects to your gardens. We carry showy milkweed seeds. Milkweed is the only plant the Monarch butterfly will lay its eggs on.

**L**ove is in the air . . . just watch the "birds and the bees and the flowers and the trees". Show your garden how much you love it by giving all you plants a good drench with Age-Old Liquid fertilizer.
